Evelina has written in her ambassador's speech about Malaysia:

Your Excellency the Secretary General, Sir/Madam President, Honorable Chairs, fellow delegates.

Malaysia is a multi-ethnic, multi-religious country that possesses one of south-east Asia's most vibrant economies. The country is among the world's biggest producers of computer disk drives, palm oil, rubber

and timber. It has a state-controlled car maker, Proton, and tourism has considerable room for expansion. Although Malaysia's Human Right record has been stained in the past, the Delegation of Malaysia is willing to openly debate possible solutions to the issues occurring. Malaysia was also chosen to be part of the Security Council for three consecutive years.

Of course, we have been facing challenges in different domains and we are trying to cope with them as peacefully as possible. In order to prosper we need to accept diversity as a part of human nature and participate in the making of a new nation offering inclusion and not exclusion. In these dark times that the world is going through Security issues as well as economical ones, we must unite to overcome our difficulties.
